6.2 Overview of LA City Parks Needs Assessment (PNA)

Darryl Ford (Superintendent of Planning, LA City Department of Recreation and Parks), Sarah Swanseen (Senior Landscape Architect, OLIN), and Thomson Dryjanski (Senior Associate, Estolano Advisors) presented on the LA City Parks Needs Assessment.

Commissioner Rene' Williams recommended that the LANAIC appoint a commissioner to serve on the LA City Parks Needs Assessment (PNA) Steering Committee.

Discussion Items

7.1 Discussion of the February 15, 2025 LANAIC Community Listening Session

Commissioner Caroline Bhalla shared a recap of the February 15, 2025 Community Listening Session. She shared that the event was a success and was well received by participants. She discussed takeaways from the table she facilitated, including strategies she used to support the emotional dialogues.

7.2. Discussion of AIAN Homelessness in LA County

Commissioner Andrea Garcia briefly shared about the upcoming *Natives in L.A. Summit: Envisioning Home Across Generations* and encouraged commissioners to attend and share the event with their networks. She shared that this is a culminating part of her Stanton Fellowship.

7.3. Discussion of Impacts of Federal Administration on LA County's AIAN Community

Vice Chairperson Villasenor facilitated the LANAIC in a brief discussion about how the current federal administration's policies are impacting Native people. Commissioner Bhalla shared about a decision made that day to remove information regarding the Navajo Code Talkers from federal websites. It was shared that that decision had already been reversed since being announced.

Commissioner Ortega Jr. discussed how his tribe is approaching responding to the actions of the Trump administration and that they are taking time to observe, since many actions are being reversed. Commissioner Castro shared that although the AIAN community may fly under the radar, it will take a multicultural coalition to fight back, and it is important that the AIAN community is a part of that.

Self Governance Board Chair Dawn Jackson shared that the SGB’s focus has been the 2026-2027 CSBG Community Needs Assessment and Community Action Plan and encouraged the commissioners to participate in the Saturday, May 17, 2025, CSBG Public Hearing at LA City College from 10 am to 12 pm. Alexandra shared that she continues to monitor the impacts of the federal administration on CSBG.

11.3 2025 Native American Heritage Month Ad-hoc Committee

2025 NAHM Ad-Hoc Committee Chair Lewis-Smith shared that both Councilmembers Rodriguez (CD7) and Hernandez (CD10) both had to decline hosting this year’s City Hall celebration and that the Ad-Hoc is currently looking for a sponsor and funding. He also shared that Alexandra will be emailing later this week to solicit 2025 NAHM Theme nominations and that the LANAIC will select a theme at the April 15, 2025 meeting. Finally, he shared that the Ad-Hoc has discussed honoring the various tribal firefighter crews that fought the LA Fires in January.

She also shared that they received a marked-up version of the bylaws from Heather Rigby. She shared the bylaws contained comments and questions from Counsel and Heather. Subject: 2025 Native American Heritage Month Theme Nominations

On March 18, 2025 at the regular meeting of the Los Angeles City/County Native American Indian Commission (LANAIC) Commissioner Bryce Lewis-Smith shared about the body's process to select a Native American Heritage Month (NAHM) theme. On March 19, 2025 I requested via email NAHM theme nominations from LANAIC commissioners.

The LANAIC is being asked to select, via vote, one theme to recommend to both LA City and LA County to use as the 2025 NAHM Theme (April 15, 2025 LANAIC Meeting – Item 6.3). In the past the theme has been used in various ways including on the LA City NAHM Booklet and reception program book, as inspiration for LA City Hall Bridge Gallery artists and included in the LA City NAHM Resolution and LA County Board Motion.

Below is the list of themes that were submitted by the April 7, 2025 deadlines.

1. A Circle of CommUNITY
2. Expanding the Circle of Our Community
3. United in Strength & Care for Our Community
4. Honoring our Warriors: Past, Present, and Future
5. Guardians of Mother Earth: Today and Tomorrow
6. Honoring our Protectors: The Spirit of Courage and Braver
7. **Firekeepers: Honoring Tribal Firefighters, Indigenous Stewardship, and Future Ancestors** – Recognizing the bravery of Tribal Firefighters, the wisdom of Indigenous fire practices, and the Tribal Youth in protecting and restoring the Land.
8. **Sacred Fire: Honoring Indigenous Fire Practices Following the 2025 Los Angeles Fires** – Centering California Tribes' efforts to restore cultural burns and revitalize the balance between fire and ecosystem health.

CIVIL RIGHTS, EQUITY, IMMIGRATION, AGING AND DISABILITY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to directing the Civil + Human Rights and Equity Department (CHRED), in collaboration with the Los Angeles City/County Native American Indian Commission (LANAIC) and representatives from the Tongva, Tataviam and Chumash tribes, with the assistance of the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), to report on the creation of a Los Angeles City land acknowledgement policy; and CHRED reports relative to the cultural and historic regional components necessary for the consideration of a Land Acknowledgment Policy for the City of Los Angeles.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (O'Farrell - Koretz):

1. NOTE and FILE the CHRED report dated October 17, 2023, attached to Council file No. 22-1142.
2. NOTE and FILE the CHRED report dated November 27, 2024, attached to said Council file No.
3. REQUEST the LANAIC to convene an ad hoc subcommittee consisting of all City - appointed Commission members to propose, to the full Commission for approval, a land acknowledgment statement consistent with the values and considerations learned through LA Civil Rights' and the Civic Memory Working Group's research using the County Language as a starting point.
4. INSTRUCT the CHRED to report on the recommendations of the Commission.
5. INSTRUCT the City Administrative Officer (CAO) to identify funding, which may include current unallocated funding in the Heritage Month accounts, for the CHRED to support the convening of working group, to assist the LANAIC ad hoc subcommittee, to develop language for a land acknowledgment statement.
6. INSTRUCT the CAO to report back to Council a part-time position for the CHRED. This report should include identifying a funding source for staffing a part-time position at the CHRED and determine an appropriate classification with expertise in Tribal history and law to support LANAIC.
7. REQUEST the LANAIC to propose legislation and initiatives that support and further acknowledge the Native Tribal Nations that have and continue to contribute to Los Angeles.
8. INSTRUCT the CAO, with the assistance of the CLA and the CHRED, to review the current Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the County regarding the LANAIC and recommend potential amendments to increase City engagement with the Commission.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CHRED reports that there is no fiscal impact with the submission of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted

SUMMARY

At the meeting held on February 7, 2024, your Civil Rights, Equity, Immigration, Aging and Disability Committee considered a Motion (O'Farrell - Koretz) relative to directing the CHRED, in collaboration with the LANAIC and representatives from the Tongva, Tataviam and Chumash tribes, with the assistance of the CLA, to report on the creation of a Los Angeles City land acknowledgement policy; and CHRED revised report relative to the cultural and historic regional components necessary for the consideration of a Land Acknowledgment Policy for the City of Los Angeles.

After an opportunity for public comment was held, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations, as amended, as stated above. This matter is now submitted to the Council for consideration.
